About this grant scheme

Crowborough Town Council has teamed up with YouthBank so that young people in the Crowborough and surrounding area can have more of a say over how money for them is spent!

YouthBank is an innovative youth led grant-giving scheme. It is run by young people for young people. YouthBanks provide small grants to fund young people's good ideas to benefit their local community.

Young people put forward their own ideas for projects that improve the things they have to do and the places they have to go.

It is other young people that decide who gets the grants. This year the decision-making panel for Crowborough grants will be Crowborough Youth Council. If you are aged between 13 and 19 and would like to be involved in the youth council please get in touch with us (contact details on page 10).

The money for this grant scheme comes from Crowborough Town Council with an additional contribution from East Sussex County Council.

Please read the guidance notes below. These notes will tell you who can apply for a grant and the kinds of things you will be able to get the money for.

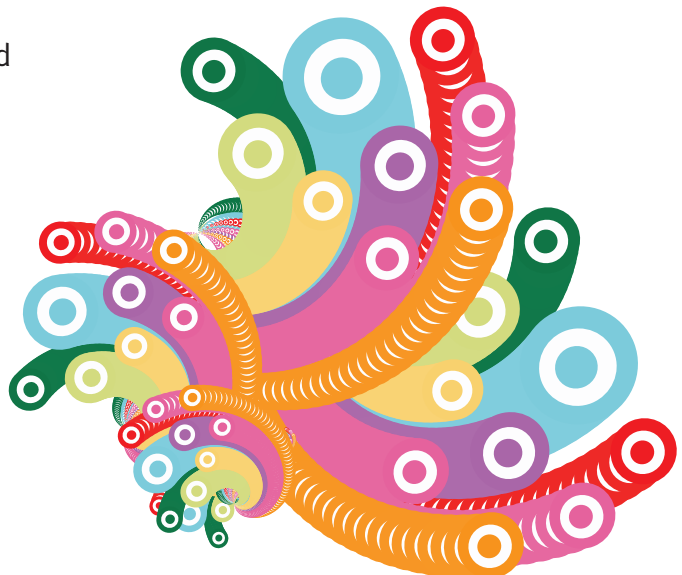
You can also call the YouthBank Co-ordinator for advice on how to fill in the form. She can also visit your group and help you to put in a good application.

Who can apply for a grant?

You can apply for any amount between £200 up to £1,200 if you can say yes to the following:

- You are all aged between 11 and 19, (or up to age 25 with any kind of special need or disability).
- At least one of the people on the application form lives in Crowborough.
- There are at least two people making the application.
- The project takes place, and is for, the benefit of young people living in the Crowborough and immediate surrounding areas.
- Immediate surrounding areas extend as far as villages such as Rotherfield and not beyond.
- There is a supporting organisation that is able to take the money on your behalf and help you to spend it on your project.
- The supporting organisation is a constituted group that has a child protection policy and is willing to gain FREE affiliation to East Sussex Council for Voluntary Youth Services (ESCVYS). See back page.
- The project has come from your own ideas and adults have only been involved in a supporting role to help you to make an achievable application.



What kind of things can I apply to get money for?

- ✓ Things that will help to improve things to do and places to go for young people in your area.
- ✓ Projects that help the older and younger generation get along better!
- ✓ Projects that help young people have a say in their area (like helping to set up a youth forum or a youth council etc.)
- ✓ Projects that give you a chance to learn something new that will benefit your group or community (e.g. try a new skill, learn how to plan things, give you confidence, etc.)
- ✓ Projects that help you achieve something and improve the reputation of young people in your community.

What can't I get money for?

- ✗ Projects that happen at school anytime during the school day or support the curriculum.
- ✗ Any kind of administrative or management costs of your supporting organisation.
- ✗ Tax and insurance of any vehicles.
- ✗ Rent, utility bills, wages, cleaning bill etc.
- ✗ Projects that are entirely determined by adults or can't show that young people have been involved in the design and development of the project.
- ✗ Projects that promote a particular political or religious view.
- ✗ Trips outside of the UK.
- ✗ Trips that cannot demonstrate a clear learning outcome.

✗ Equipment / training costs for your own personal use.

✗ Charity fund raising projects.

Handy tips on how to fill in this form

- When you've decided what kind of project you want to do and how much it will cost, you will need to fill in this form and explain it to us.
- The panel who will read this form will know nothing about your project so give them as much information as you can.
- Before you send in the form, ask somebody else to read it through and ask them for their opinion. Is it clear to them what you want the money for and why you want it?
- You don't need to be good at spelling or English. We just need to understand clearly what you want to do with the money and that it is a good project!
- If you're not great at expressing yourself in writing then why not make a short five minute DVD and tell us about your project on film!
- Imagine it is your responsibility to give this money away. Do you think your application would make it through!?
- You can also call the YouthBank co-ordinator who can give you help and advice. She can even come and visit your group and show you how we judge bids and the kinds of things that will make your application successful.
- Good luck and don't forget to contact us if you have any questions. We are always happy to help!

- Once this letter of agreement is signed and returned we will then release the money to you. This can sometimes take up to 21 – 30 days to reach the bank account. Please take this into account when you are planning your project.
- When your project is complete we will ask you to complete a short evaluation form that tells us how many young people benefited from the grant and what you learnt from the project.
